ABOUT THESE DESIGNS

INTERACTIVE PDF FORMAT

- You may print these instructions like any other PDF file.
- Or you can view it on your computer, tablet or phone for an interactive version.
- Links, buttons, check boxes, forms, and even a notes section can be filled out and saved by you. Your notes are private and only reside in your version of the file. Links and buttons will take you to the Ballyhoo Creations website where you are invited to share your feedback with me if you choose.

LICENSE AND TERMS OF USE

This is the licensing you agreed to when acquiring the embroidery files. This agreement is legally binding.

All embroidery design files and digital patterns are copyright Ballyhoo Creations 2020. By purchasing these digital products you agree to the following:

1. You (the customer) MAY NOT share, loan, rent or sell these Ballyhoo digital files with anyone, even if you obtained it from Ballyhoo for free. (Why? Read the [FAQ on the website](#) for more info)
2. You CAN make a backup copy for your own file security (to protect against a hard drive crash, accidental delete, etc.)
3. You CAN (and I hope you do!) Embroider or sew projects with these files and sell those finished goods as long as it's less than 500 units per design. This is the Ballyhoo way of promoting small handmade business. You may sell your finished projects at places like craft fairs, Etsy, your own website, or brick and mortar stores as long as the item count per purchased design is less than 500 items. This limit of 500 applies to all things you make with the design. For example: 20 dolls + 300 shirts + 180 baby bibs = 500 units. Each design purchased allows for 500 pieces of THAT design.
4. Of course you CAN stitch projects for yourself or others as long as it doesn't exceed the 500 units mentioned above. This includes gifts and charity donations.
5. You MAY NOT modify any part of Ballyhoo designs with the intent to distribute. This means you may not sell, trade or share your own version of Ballyhoo artwork as embroidery files, graphic design files, electronic cutting machines files and any other sort of digital file in future technologies. You are allowed to create your own digital files for personal use, such as a digital cutting file to accompany an embroidery design, or add text to one of Ballyhoo's designs for your own use.

PREP WORK

TOOLS

1. Embroidery machine with 5x7" or 6x10" or larger hoop
2. Sharp fabric scissors
3. Small embroidery scissors

MATERIALS

1. Tear-away embroidery stabilizer
2. Machine Embroidery thread to coordinate with your fabrics
3. Fabrics: non-fray fabrics such as felt, fleece or stretch jersey in these sizes

For the 6x10 hoop (11" Doll)

- for hat 8" x 5"
- for boots 5.5" x 2.5"
- for collar 3" x 3"
- for mittens 2" x 3"

For the 5x7 hoop (8" Doll)

- for hat 4" x 5.5"
- for boots 4" x 2"
- for collar 2.5" x 2.5"
- for mittens 2.25" x 1.5"

ELF ACCESSORY SET INSTRUCTIONS

1. Hoop tear-away stabilizer in the appropriate sized hoop for your project. 5x7 hoop is used for 8" doll elf accessories, while the 6x10 hoop is needed for the 11" doll
2. Thread your machine with embroidery thread that will look nice on your felt

HAT

3. STITCH COLOR 1. This will outline the hat with an arrow showing the direction of stretch and also a fold line.
4. Take your 8x5" stretch fabric and fold it in half. Then place it over the outline on the stabilizer with the fold of the fabric on the fold line.
5. STITCH COLOR 2 to create the hat seam. Leave the hat in the hoop, but flip the fabric out of the way to keep it from interfering with the other items.

BOOTS

6. STITCH COLOR 3 to create a placement box for the boots.
7. Place two pieces of felt that are 5.5" by 2.5" over the boot placement box. You can tape or use gluestick to hold them down if you need to.
8. STITCH COLOR 4 which stitches the borders of the boots

COLLAR

9. STITCH COLOR 5 to create a placement box for the collar
10. Place one piece of 3" x 3" felt over the collar placement box
11. STITCH COLOR 6 to create the outline and decorative stitches on the collar

ELF ACCESSORY SET INSTRUCTIONS (CoNT.)

MITTENS

12. STITCH COLOR 7 to create a placement box for the mittens
13. Place two pieces of felt measuring 2" x 3" over the mitten placement box
14. STITCH COLOR 8 to create the border stitches on the mittens

ASSEMBLY

15. Remove the hoop from your machine but don't unhoop the project yet.
16. It's easier to tear away the pieces while still in the hoop so you can take advantage of the hoop tension. Gently tear the pieces away from the stabilizer and remove all the stablizer bits from each piece.
17. Cut out each piece using sharp scissors. Trim any jump threads.
18. Turn the hat inside out to hide the seam.
19. IMPORTANT!! It's easier to put the boots and mittens on the doll BEFORE you stuff the arms and legs.
20. Dress your cloth character in their new accessories and enjoy your little Elf!
